


The dumpster next to the pool house is for use by our maintenance people for disposal of siding and roofing materials. Please do not use it for your personal discards.

BIRD NERD CORNER

I'm dedicating this month's report to random thoughts I had while quarantined with COVID. (We're feeling fine but can't get the test strips to agree with us yet!) If you must be stuck at home, it was nice that the Tour de France was going on. We sat out on our deck, watching TV, wishing we were in France and wondering how on earth those bicyclists do it. As a bonus, the network helicopters caught great pictures of all sorts of gliding and soaring birds that we don't have over here!

I spend a good portion of my day at my desk in the den, and my only view is of Gogola's front yard, for which I am grateful, as they have a beautiful garden! One rainy day, I noticed many leaves moving with the breeze in the grass. Then one "leaf" popped up to reveal itself as a sparrow. The whole lawn was full of various sparrows nibbling on bugs and seeds. And this is where you think I will enlighten you on all those different types of sparrows -- nope! Over here, we call them "LBBs" ("Little Brown Birds) because they belong right in there with the "Confusing Fall Warblers" category.

Hummingbirds are fledged now and starting to explore their surroundings since there aren't as many blooms where they can feed. So keep your nectar feeders fresh! There is also something else the little buzzers might appreciate, as Bob Loomis found out, to his surprise. He was standing in his yard, watering his garden when he noticed a hummingbird that kept whizzing around his arm. He held the hose spray still, and sure enough, the little guy happily flew in and out of the mist, getting a nice bath.

The Great Blue Heron world at our end has calmed down, but early July was a frenzy of as many as six Herons at a time, using the time after dinner to play and chase each other all over the cove. Watching their graceful flights was a delight, and the games and sneak attacks were highly entertaining. The Heron who has always lived here (who we've named Henry) has always maintained tight control over his domain and chased off all interlopers. He usually gets challenged in early summer when the young ones arrive, looking for territory. He either is getting tired of the commotion or more lenient in his old age, as he let the nonsense go on for longer than usual in past years. (Perhaps because one of the visitors was a female? He left her alone!) Now that calm has returned, only one Heron is in the area, and we assume that is Henry, having successfully vanquished all comers. He has a distinctive "GAWK-GAWK" call, so we'll know soon!

Have you noticed elegant flyers swooping through the air and diving down to the water's surface in swinging arcs? No, they did not just sneak into the cinema to see "Top Gun"!





Those are swallows, trying to rid us of gnats and mosquitoes, darlings that they are. They are beautiful birds if you are lucky enough to see one up close. Look for them perched high in trees, or on wires, over in the Conservancy.

When you are sailing down to the Club, look up as you pass under the Keystone bridge, and you will see their peculiar nests tucked up in the top angles of the beams. Here is a picture of the muddy round shapes you are looking for.



The Chief Bird Nerd saw something extraordinary last week – fifteen Great Egrets gathered on the sand flats at the end of our Conservancy, where the river comes around the bend past the island. Unfortunately, he didn't get a picture, but this is what they look like if such a rare sight ever comes our way again.




In closing, Judy Bourquin's resident Goldfinches posed for a picture the other day – they knew how good they looked amidst her flowers!
